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

Medically Fragile Foster Care

For over two decades, through its Placement Services program, Childkind has offered specialized multidisciplinary foster care placement for children with complex medical and developmental disabilities.

Fully accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA), Child-kind's model programming has documented success at serving children with multiple health challenges.

Therapeutic Foster Care

The target population for Childkind's Therapeutic Foster Care program is children with significant behavioral and developmental challenges in foster care, especially those at risk for or who have experienced multiple placement disruptions.

Childkind's program accepts children up to age 18.

Family Foster Care

Since 1992 Childkind has been providing family-based foster care services for children in state custody.

Childkind was founded in 1989 as a group home for HIV+/AIDS affected children. In 1992 Childkind closed it congregate care facility and began serving children in family-based placements.

Medically-Based Parenting


Childkind developed an evidence-informed parenting program model called *Take Charge! Medically-Based Parenting*.

Not only has the model shown success at building parental care capacity and preventing family break-up, it has also documented success at dramatically lowering healthcare costs.
